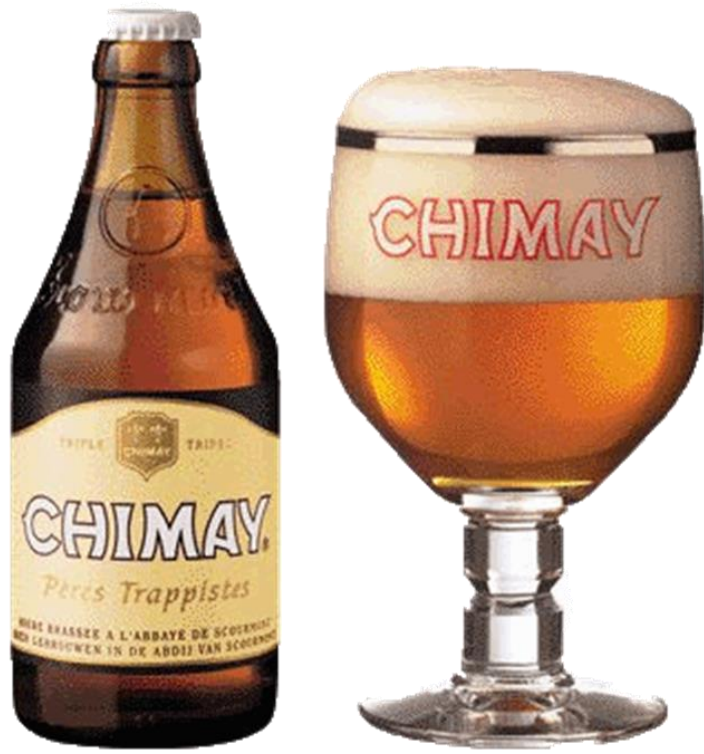

TRAPPIST beers are brewed by monks behind the walls of an abbey and regarded as the best tasting beers in the world. They are strong in flavor and alcohol

Chimay White Cinq Cents Triple, 8%

The Chimay Triple, "Cinq Cents" is golden in color, and combines sweet and bitter in a rare balance. The beer's aroma felt in the mouth comes from the hops'



perfumes: above all, there are fruity touches of Muscat Grapes, raisins, & even ripe apples.

Scourmount Abbey Chimay, Belgium

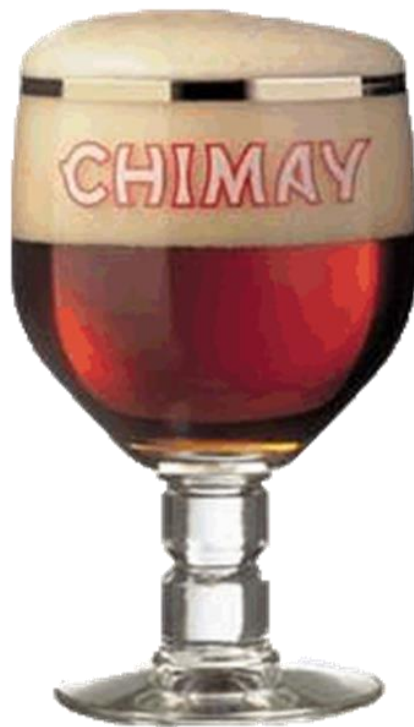
The abbey, which according to Trappist rules is located behind the walls of ***Notre Dame de Scourmount Abbey***, is celebrating 150 years. We were blessed with a detailed tour of the brewery. At the end we were offered a rare 1996 Premier, covered with dust.



The beer inside had mellowed in flavors and the carbonation had subdued.

Chimay Red or Premiere Dubbel style, 7%

The red possesses a beautiful coppery color topped with a creamy head, it gives off a slight apricot smell from the fermentation.



The aroma felt in the mouth is a balance confirming the fruit nuances revealed in the sense of smell.

Scourmount Abbey Chimay, Belgium

The abbey, which according to Trappist rules is located behind the walls of Notre Dame de Scourmount Abbey, is celebrating 150 years. It is located on beautiful pastoral grounds. You are able to walk most of the property by your-



self. The brewery is off limits except for guests. If you're lucky you may spot a Monk.

Chimay Blue or Reserve Quad style, 9%

A dark Trappist beer with a powerful aroma, the complex flavor of which improves across the years. It was first brewed as a Christmas beer, ex-

plaining the presence of a "vintage". Its aroma accents a caramelized note and tastes of holiday dried fruits.



Scourmount Abbey Chimay, Belgium

It's a tricky drive from Brussels to the Brewery, its better to base yourself closer to the abbey for a visit. On our visit we came across an unusual site in the middle of a round-about on the way to Chimay...a copper mash tun! How cool!

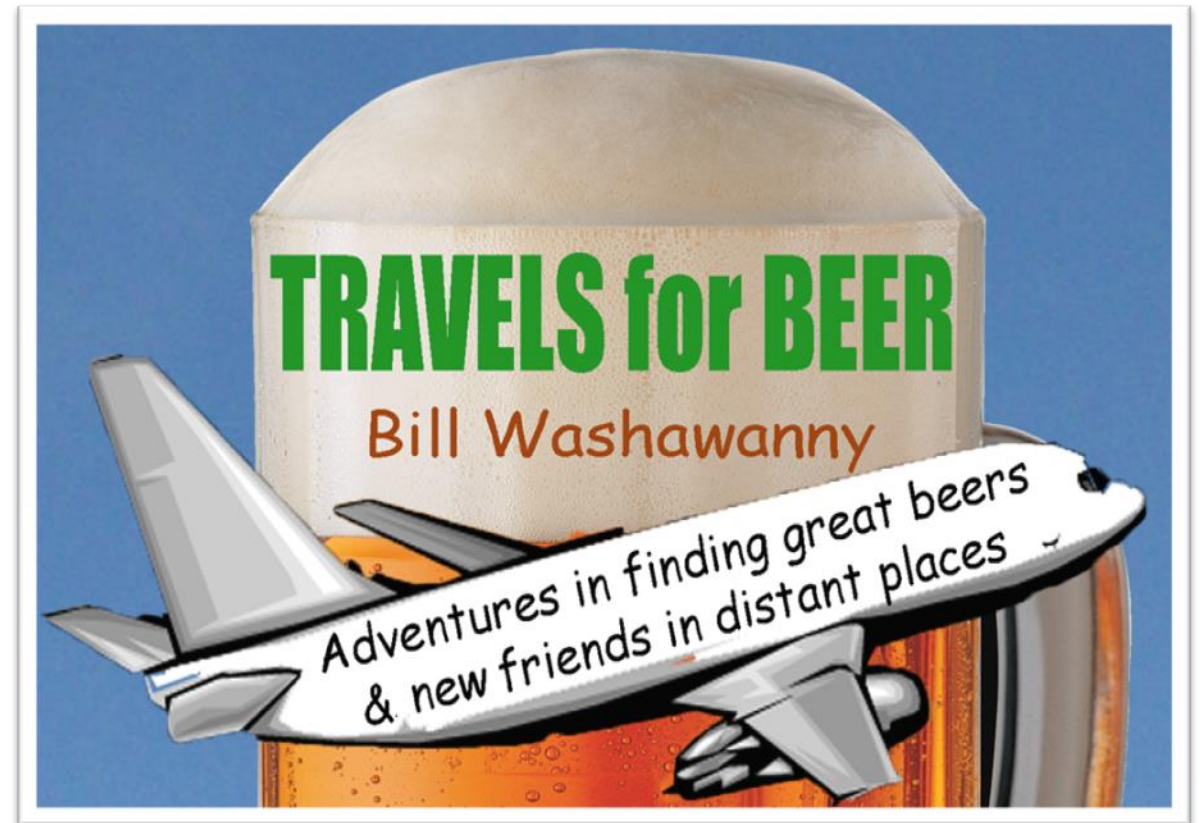


Gregorius Strong Ale, 9.7%

The newest and 8th Trappist brewery in the world. Organic honey is used along with Trappist ale yeast for the primary fermentation. Alsacian wine yeast is used in the secondary fermentation.



Stift Engelszell Engelhartszell, Austria



Orval Trappist Belgian Ale, 6.5%

The Orval Trappist brewery makes only one beer for the general public. It has an intensely aromatic and dry character. Between the first and second fermentations there is also an additional dry-hopping process where it acquires its hoppy aroma and a hint of sourness



Brasserie d' Orval Villers-devant Orval, Belgium

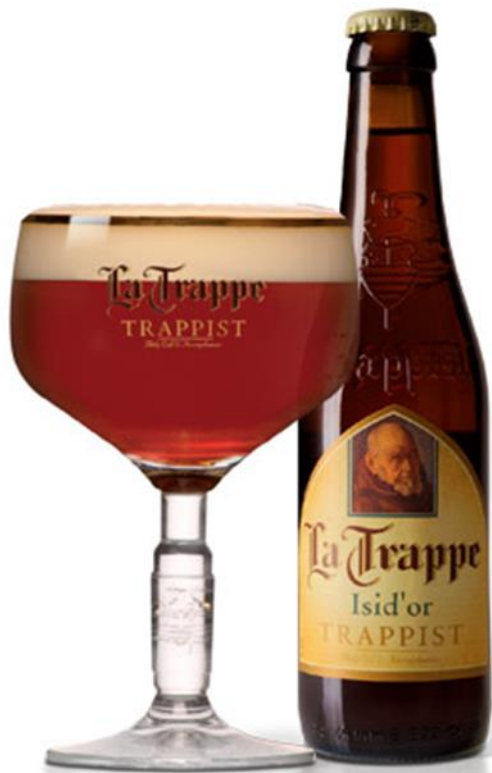
Once a year Orval has an open house. A great tour inside, access to the private grounds, and free beer & cheese. We had an opportunity to meet the Abbot! There are a few hotels close by for an overnight visit.

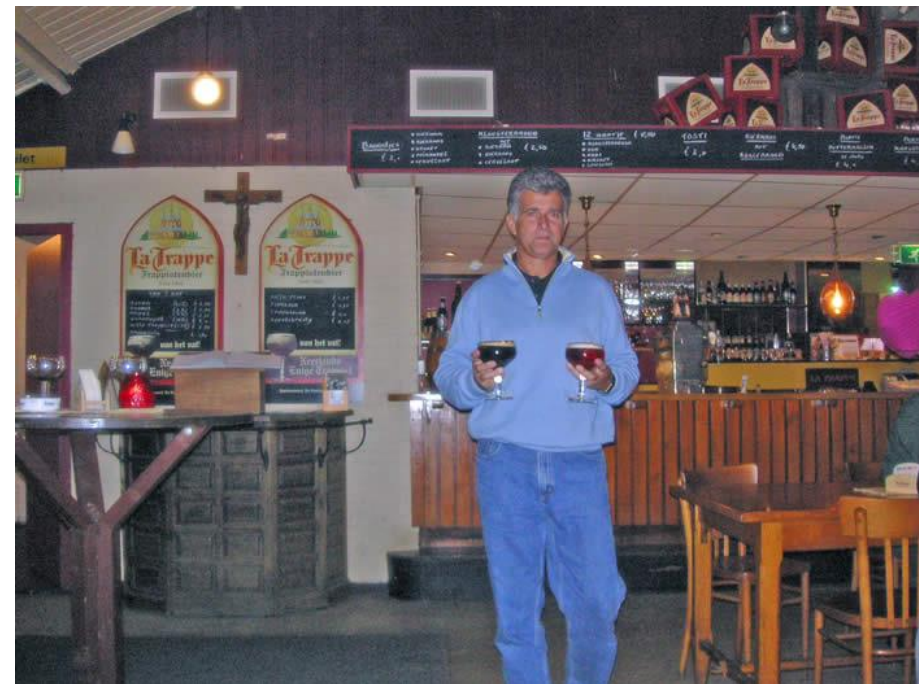
a Trappe Isid'or Trappist, 7.5%

Named after brother Isidorus, the Abbey's first brewer & to mark the occasion of the 125th anniversary. Unfiltered, slightly sweet amber ale with a hint of caramel, and has a rich, slightly bitter flavor, and a fruity aftertaste.



De Koningshoeven Brewery Tilburg, Netherlands

This is hard to get to on public transportation, but it must be on your list to visit. The Abbey and brewery are located on beautiful grounds with a public tasting room with some food. Most of their beers are on tap.



Rochefort 10 Quadruple, 11.3%

The top product from the Rochefort Trappist brewery. Dark color, full



and very impressive taste. Strong plum, raisin, and black currant palate, with wine like notes and complex flavors. Rates a 100.

Brasserie de Rochefort Rochefort, Belgium

The brewery is located within the walls of Abbey of Notre-Dame de Saint-Rémy. We did not get in, and there is no attached pub. The little town of Rochefort is the place to go to taste the beers and have some beer cuisine. How



about a bottle of #10 for \$3 with venison and dark beer sauce? Yummy!

Gold Medal 2012 World Beer Cup.

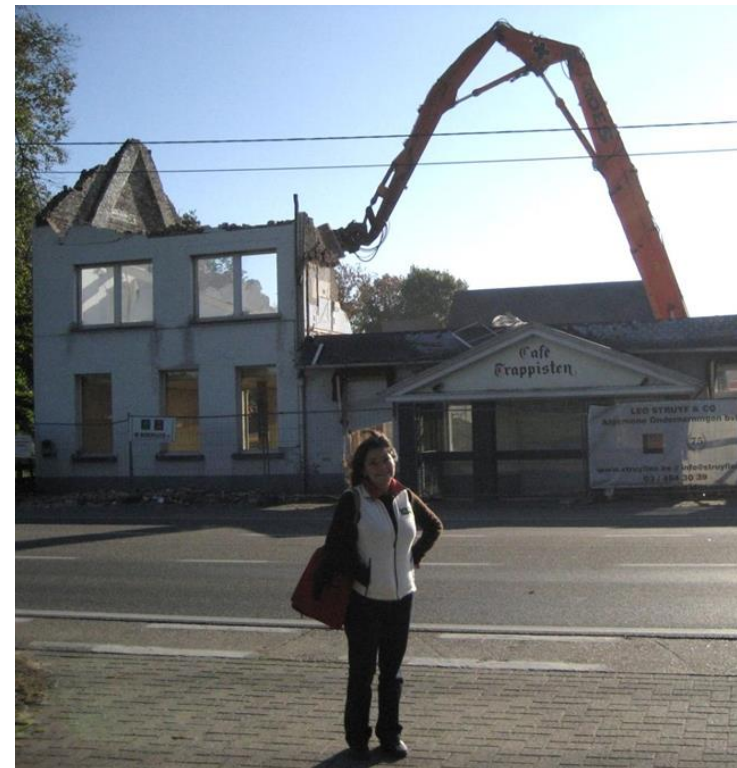

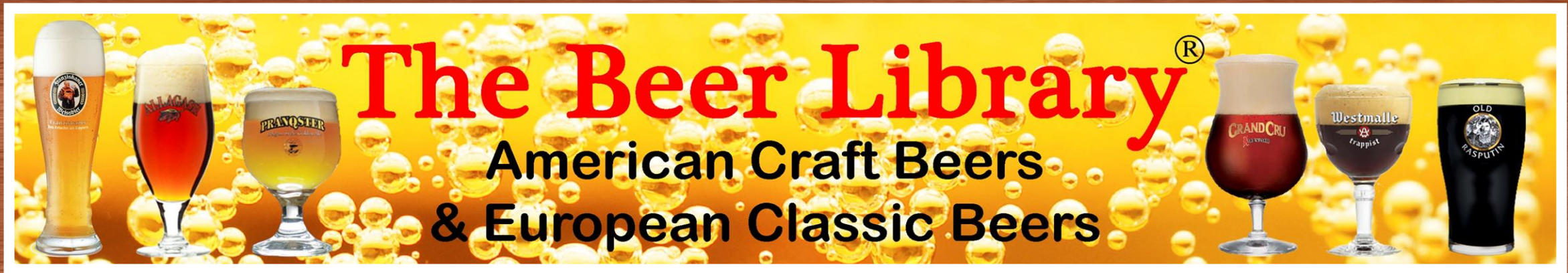


Abdij der Trappisten Van Westmalle Westmalle, Belgium

Merry Monks

Belgian tripel, 9.3%

This ale is bottle conditioned, which means a bit of sugar & yeast is added prior to bottling. This imparts a special effervescence to the beer, a creamier carbonation, and extends the shelf life. The on-going fermentation will change the character of the beer as it ages.



Weyerbacher Brewing, Pa.

Easton, Pennsylvania

Founded by Dan and Sue Weirback in 1995, they believe that Weyerbacher was the original spelling of their German ancestor's name who emigrated to America 200 years ago. The brewery is located across the border from NJ just off of I78.



Victory Golden Monkey Belgian Ale, 9.5%

Strong and sensual, this golden ale glows. The richness of German malts and Belgian yeast are

tempered by a sparkling approach and overall light body. Abundant herbal, fruity notes make it one to savor.



Victory Brewing Downingtown, PA.

The Victory Brew Pub is huge and cavernous. Beer pennants hang from the ceiling, and tops of copper brew kettles cover two tap systems behind a forty foot long bar.



Trois Pistoles Belgian Strong, 9%

Strong Belgian type ale similar to a Port wine ! It is as dark as can be, mellow in taste with an aroma of ripe fruits. It can be compared to an old port and is brewed from well roasted malt.



Unibroue Brewing, Chambly, Canada

They were the first N.A. brewer to use centuries-old traditions of Trappist methods in Europe. We visited their sister restaurant Fourquet Fourchette to taste the



beers and pair with the local cuisine.

ABT 12

Quadruple, 10%

Dark with a full, ivory-colored head. It has a fruity aroma, full of complex flavors and long

bittersweet finish with a hoppy bite. It's a full-bodied taste and a perfect equilibrium between malty, bitter and sweet.



St. Bernardus Brewing Watou, Belgium

Set in the hop area of Poperinge, you can sleep just 100 meters away at the comfy B&B Brouwershuis (with a fully stocked frig!)

They still use the original mash kettle!



Pictured with the kettle are Bill, Nina, and *Bon Beer Voyage* tour operators Ruth and Mike.

Three Philosophers Quadruple, 9.7%

A blend of a Belgian-style strong dark ale and Kriek, a cherry ale from Belgium. Chestnut color, it's opaque with full carbonation topped by a smooth, tan head. Flavors and aromas of roasted malt, molasses and brown sugar, dark fruits, brandied raisins and chocolate



Brewery Ommegang Cooperstown, New York

You can spend four hours at the Hall of Fame and then spend four hours at the pub at Ommegang. The brewery is 5 miles out of town in a pastoral setting. Ommegang pours Belgian style beers. The food menu is also impressive



North Coast Pranqster Belgian style gold ale, 7.6%

Belgian style brewing uses sophisticated techniques, yeast strains and flavoring elements. PranQster follows in this tradition using a mixed culture of antique yeast strains that produce a floral nose, a full fruity flavor, and a clean finish.



North Coast Brewing Co. Ft. Bragg, California

This is a beautiful seaside town to visit. They have a friendly pub, with the taps pouring 16 different beers on our visit and all the pours were available in a taster size! The food menu is perfect with beer.



Maredsous Triple Triple, 10%

Golden color, festive sparkle,
creamy body, and luscious head.
Drinks with elegant smoothness

Duvel Moortgat Brewing Breendonk, Belgium

We visited the abbey to see where
it all began. They no longer brew
the beer here. The buildings are
beautiful and the church bells
inspiring. Nearby is a cafeteria to



sample

Leffe Blond

Belgian Golden ale, 6.6%

Leffe Blond is a pale abbey beer, with a full, sunny, golden colour. It has a smooth and full bodied taste and a

rich creamy head. Like all the Leffe beers, it is a 'connoisseur' beer that is easy to drink.



InBev Brewing Leuven, Belgium

Brewing began in 1242 at Notre-Dame de Leffe. You've seen the Abbey on the label, this is the inside of the church with spectacular stain glass. The Abbey is located in Dinant.



Brewing is no longer done here.

Abbey Dubbel

Belgian style dubbel, 7.2%

It is an exceptionally complex beer with many interwoven flavors and features an immense head with a fruity nose and a generous body. Malty in the middle, the beer features a clean, almondy dry finish and a slight alcohol warmth.



Flying Fish Brewing

Somerdale, NJ

Be on the lookout for the exciting Exit Series of beers. The recipes are crafted in regards to historical significance to locations along the NJ Turnpike for which they are named.



Duvel

Belgian Golden ale, 8.5%

The huge, creamy head, delicate effervescence and silky smooth mouth feel is what distinguishes it from others along with its subtly bitter bite and

delicate aroma. The beer is chilled for 6 weeks in cold cellars that is unique.



Duvel Moortgatt

Breendonk, Belgium

The brewery is 2 trains, one bus, and a hike from Bruges. They require a reservation for a tour and no beer tasting is allowed without the tour. If you're



lucky you can join a tour the day of. Duvel now also owns A'Chouffe, Ommegang, Maredsous, Liefmans and Boulevard. Good beer choices and good swag shop.



LAMBIC ales use spontaneous fermentation with natural wild yeast and natural bacteria for a tart and crisp finish. Often blended with fruit for balanced sweetness

Lindemans Peche Lambic, 2.5%



A fresh fruity drink with the background of the rich bouquet of Lambic. Taste: Golden in color; with a nose that fills the room with fresh peaches. Sparkling, crisp and a refreshing balance of fruit and acid.

Lindemans Brewing Vlezenbeck, Belgium

The Lambic brewing area is Southwest of Brussels where a specific wild yeast of the area



spontaneously ferments the wort. Brewing is done October- May when temperatures are less than 15C

Lindemans Framboise Lambic, 2.5%



Long before hops were common in most beers, various fruits and vegetables were used to season beers. The acidity of Lambic beers blends perfectly with raspberries. Taste: Magnificent aroma, delicate palate of raspberries with undertones of fruity acidity; elegant, sparkling clean natural taste.

Lindemans Brewing Vlezenbeck, Belgium

Dirk Lindemans, pictured, and his cousin Geert Lindemans together operate the brewery. Six generations



ago the family owned a farm here. Farming ceased in 1932 and brewing became fulltime. In 1991 the facilities were expanded to meet demand

Lindemans Kriek Lambic, 2.5%



This sweet-acid drink was obtained by adding fresh black cherries to a barrel Lambic of 6 months young. The addition of fruits provokes a new fermentation in the oak barrels. After another 8 to 12 months, only peels and stones left and the Kriek-Lambic is ready to be filtered and bottled.

Lindemans Brewing Vlezenbeck, Belgium

Two thirds young Lambic is blended with one third old Lambic and then refermented again in the bottle using the Champagne style for another six months to create *Geuze*. With so much fermenting time needed there



are many storage barrels on the property both in wood and steel

Goudenband Lambic, 8%



Made in open vats with beer of mixed fermentation, it is left to mature for four to 12 months in the cellar. You'll immediately pick up on the wonderful aromas of caramel, apple, rhubarb, cherries and malt. On the taste buds you will find hints of apple and cherries, combined with woody notes, while the aftertaste hints at nuts and dried raisins.

Brewery Liefmans Oudenaard, Belgium,

Liefmans is now owned by Duvel Moortgaat. We journeyed there using a couple of trains and a bus. We arrived with no tour reservation however we were allowed to join a tour of the site & a couple of beers afterwards. The staff was very



friendly and offered us to taste this beer. We loved it and added it to the menu

Lindemans Cuvee Rene Gueuze, 5%

Before bottling a blend is made of 2/3 young Lambic and 1/3 old Lambic. The bottles, with the wild-spontaneous yeast flora, are refermented in the cellar. After 6 months the Gueuze obtains a golden color and a cidery, winery palate with a more complex and natural flavor.



Lindemans Brewing Vlezenbeck, Belgium

During our visit Dirk Lindemans siphoned a sample of pure *lambic* from a barrel. He returned with his sample in a decorative porcelain pitcher, reminiscent of scenes from the 16th Century paintings by Breugel.



The taste was very sherry like. *Faro* is old & young lambic with candy sugar added tastes sweet & sour.



STOUTS dark roasted malt, dry to sweet in taste, light in body, tastes of coffee or toffee **IMPERIAL STOUTS** have intensified flavors

Double Stout Black Ale Stout, 5.8%

Golden naked oats mashed with dark crystal and robust roasted malts create a luscious black brew with satin smooth finish. An old-world style, big, bold, flavorful and complex.



Green Flash Brewing Co. San Diego, California

Their popularity is growing and are soon adding a second brewery in Virginia. The pub is fun to visit with food trucks at the ready and an adjacent picnic area. Inside lots of beers are on tap clearly marked and described at great prices

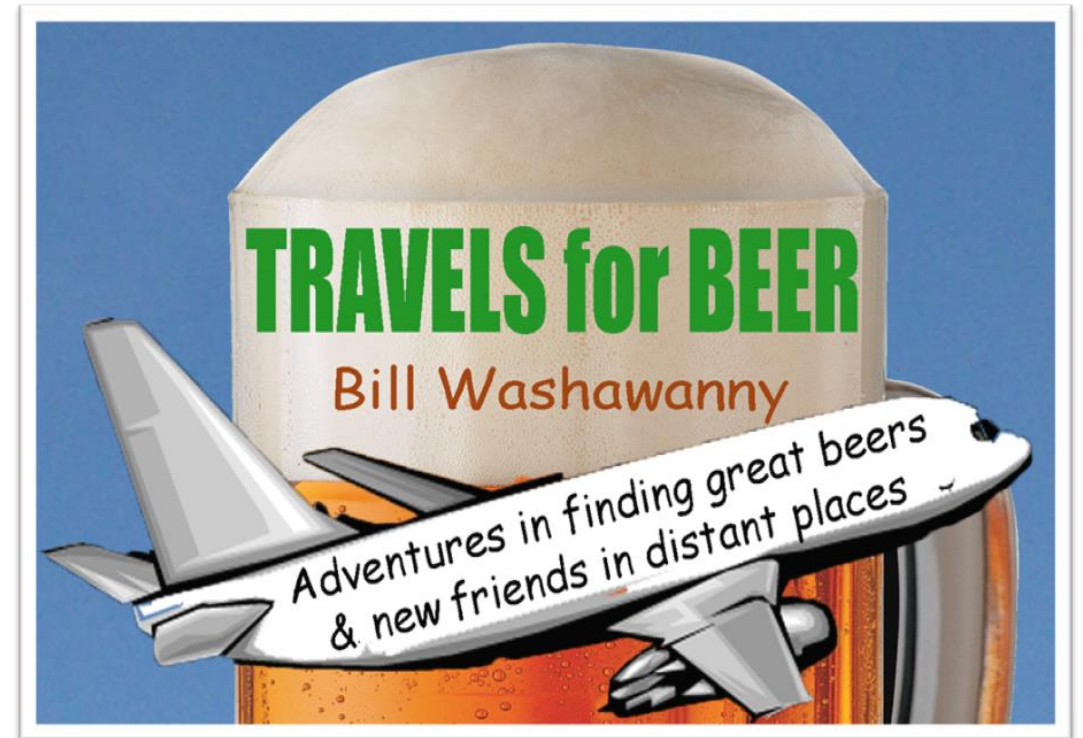


Double Chocolate Stout Stout, 5.2%

Luxurious and at the same time with a hint of decadence, delivering a satisfying, indulgent taste without ever becoming overly sweet. Pale Ale and Crystal malt, Chocolate Malt, sugars, Fuggle and Golding hops, real dark chocolate and chocolate essence are combined.



Wells and Young's Brewing Bedford, England



Allagash Black

Belgian Stout, 7.5%

Brewed with 2 Row barley, wheat, oats, both roasted and chocolate malt and a generous portion of dark caramelized candy sugar. The silky mouth feel is a great balance to the roasted character, coffee and dark chocolate notes



Allagash Brewing Co.

Portland, ME

Allagash is located in a small industrial center. During a short interesting tour we witnessed the lagering of their Curieux beer in Jim Beam barrels. They were selling the used barrels ...how to



get to SYF? A good tasting followed with 7 samples

Left Hand Milk Stout Stout, 6%

Dark and delicious, it'll change your per-ception about what a stout can be. Udderly delightful.

Left Hand Brewing Co. Longmont, Colorado

Left Hand Brewing opened in 1993 in Longmont. Why is it named Left



Hand? In honor of Chief Niwot, whose tribe wintered in the area, and Niwot is an Arapahoe Indian word meaning left hand.

Yeti

Imperial Stout, 9.5%

An onslaught of the senses. It starts with big, roasty malt flavor that gives way to rich caramel and toffee notes. YETI gets its bold hop character from an enormous quantity of American hops. It weighs in at a hefty 75 IBUs.



Great Divide Brewing Denver, Colorado

On our visit a forklift and containers filled with fresh hops beckoned our attention. The herbaceous aroma and bright green hop cones infiltrated the evening air. It's harvest season, fresh hop brewing day at Great Divide!

North Coast Old Rasputin Imperial Russian Stout, 10%

Produced in the tradition of 18th Century English brewers who supplied the court of Russia's Catherine the Great. It's a rich, intense brew with big complex flavors and a warming finish. The Old Rasputin brand image is a drawing of Rasputin with a phrase in Russian encircling it —A sincere friend is not born instantly.



North Coast Brewing Ft. Bragg, California

The pub serves great food, such as fresh grilled salmon with avocado. We were able to take home to enjoy with friends a rare bottle of the 11th Anniversary Old Rasputin that was released only at the pub.



Samuel Smith Oatmeal Stout

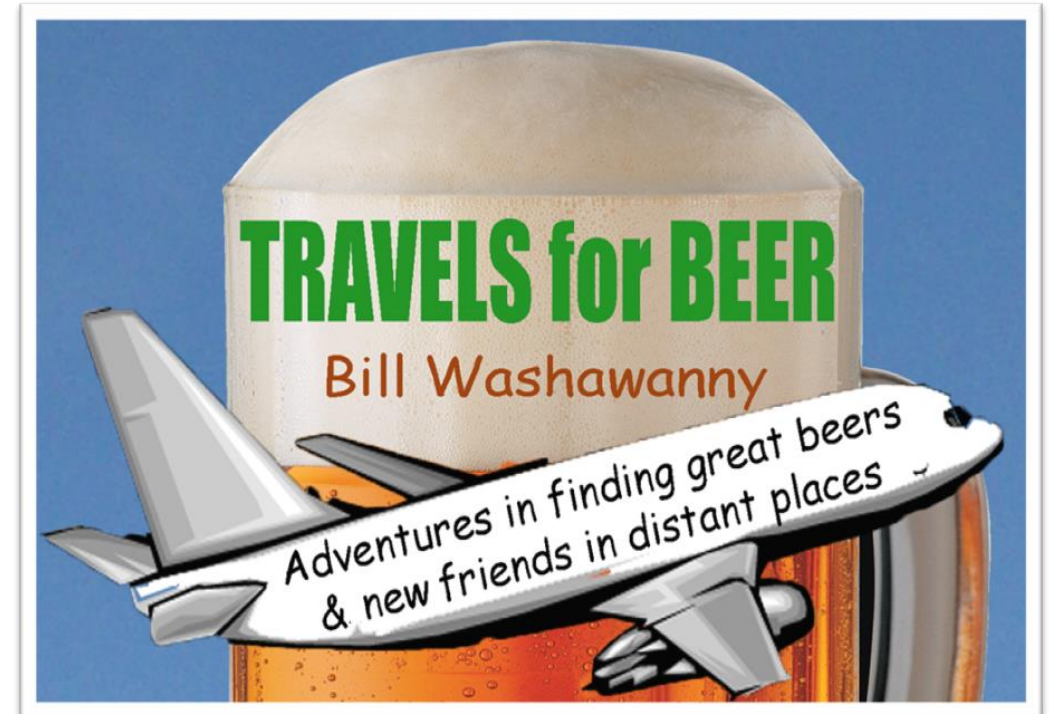
Oatmeal stout, 5%



Brewed with water from a well sunk in 1758, being drawn from 85 feet underground. Fermented in 'stone Yorkshire squares' to create an almost opaque, wonder-fully silky and smooth textured ale with a medium dry palate & bittersweet finish.

Blithering Idiot Barley wine, 11.1%



Blithering Idiot is a deep-copper ale with intense malty notes of dates and figs on the palate that follows a pleasurably malty aroma to your taste buds. The finish is warm and fruity, & begs for the next sip.

Weyerbacher Brewing Easton, Pennsylvania

The brewery offers free tours on Friday evenings and Saturday afternoons, along with a small tasting room with a wide selection to sample or purchase a bottle to



take home. Plenty of swag

Old Chub

Scottish ale, 8%

Brewed with bodacious amounts of malted barley and specialty grains, and a dash of beechwood-smoked malt. Old Chub features semi-sweet flavors of cocoa and coffee, and a wee-bit of smoke. A head-turning treat for malt heads and folks who think they don't dig dark beer



Oscar Blues Brewing

Longmont, Colorado

The Tasty Weasel, a welcoming environment to spend the afternoon, they have outdoor tables, complimentary peanuts, swag, and an abundance of wall stickers. We saw Ski Ball games in the bottling room, a free barbecue lunch being cooked for employees, and a friendly dog.



Arrogant Bastard

Strong Ale, 7.2%

This is an aggressive ale. You probably won't like it. It is quite doubtful that you have the taste or sophistication to be able to

appreciate an ale of this quality and depth. We would suggest that you stick to safer and more familiar territory—maybe something with a multi-million dollar ad campaign aimed at convincing you it's made in a little brewery, or one that implies that their tasteless fizzy yellow beverage will give you more sex appeal.



Stone Brewing

Escondido, California

The pub and brewery are difficult to locate because there are few visual markings on the building. This is also



true once inside the beautiful pub. Kind of Arrogant isn't it? However, you'll know where you are when you taste those beers!



PORTER is black in color, crisp, full body, tastes of roasted malt, chocolate and or coffee

Smoked Porter

Porter, 5.9%



This smoky version of a traditional English porter, this worldly libation is dark, smooth, and complex, with rich chocolate and coffee flavors suffused with subtle smokiness from the addition of peat-smoked malt

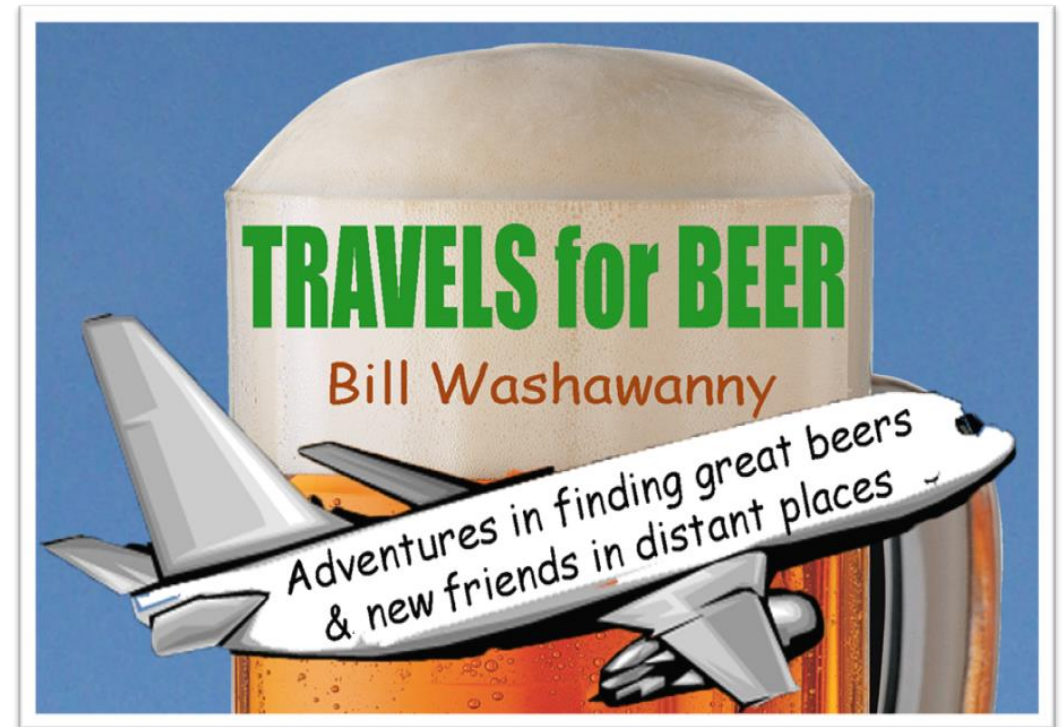


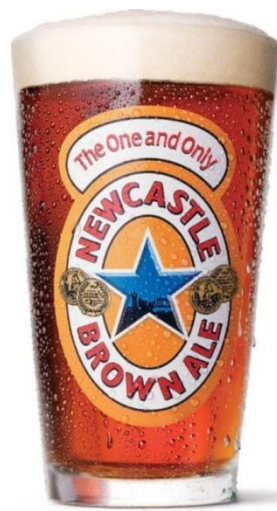
Edmond Fitzgerald Porter , 5.8%



This beer pours black, medium to heavy in body, complex, roasty aroma, with a bittersweet, chocolate-coffee taste and a bold hop presence

Great Lakes Brewing Cleveland, Ohio





BROWN ALES have a low hop profile, malty overtones, with fruit or nutty flavors. **ESB or Extra Special Bitter** are not bitter, but robust with a strong rich malt flavor

Ellies Brown ale

Brown Ale, 5.5%

This beautiful, deep russet brew has the sweet and somewhat nutty character.

Crystal and Chocolate malts give this beer a brown sugar maltiness with hints of vanilla and nuts, with subtle hopping



Avery Brewing

Boulder, Colorado

They take pride in blending Old World traditions and expertise with ingenuity, creativity and boldness.

Outside is a patio area and inside are four rooms and one is filled with



wooden barrels for aging beer blends.

Palo Santo Marron **Brown ale, 12%**

It's an unfiltered, unfettered, unprecedented brown ale aged in handmade wooden brewing vessels. The caramel and vanilla complexity unique to this beer comes from the exotic Paraguayan Palo Santo wood from which these tanks were crafted. Palo Santo means "holy tree".



Dogfish Head Brewing Co. **Milton, Delaware**

A quick, easy way to visit Dogfish from New Jersey is to take the Cape May Ferry. It's only a 90 minute trip across the Bay and a short drive to either the brewery in

There we stood at 5:30 on a Friday afternoon, in a sandstone tunnel, 30 feet underground, with a 40 degree



temperature drinking an unfiltered, unpasteurized Urquell from a wooden barrel.



LAGERS have a light body, pale to dark gold color, light bitter taste, and a smooth finish

Fruh Kolsch Lager, 4.8%

Famous for its malt aroma and delicate flavor of vanilla and flowery hops. The family recipe has been passed on for five generations. Drank out of a slim 0.2 Liter cylindrical glass,



called a “stange”, and waiters, or “Kobes”, keep serving until a customer places a coaster on the glass to indicate he/she has had enough.

Cölner Hofbräu P. Josef Früh, Cologne, Germany

Früh Kölsch is a regional specialty from Cologne, the name Kölsch is protected by law so that only beers brewed in and around the city can



bear the name. The city has nine breweries within walking distance! Located on the Rhine River, it makes for a pleasant weekend of exploring.

Budweiser

Lager, 4.5%

Budweiser is lagered in cold lager tanks for three weeks. Beechwood aging enhances fermentation creating a crisper, more sparkling carbonation while imparting smoothness to the characteristic taste of Budweiser.



Anheuser Busch-InBev

Newark, New Jersey

In 1852 two German immigrants started AB, Adolphus Busch and Eberhard Anheuser in St. Louis, Missouri. They revolutionized the brewery business with distribution by



train refrigeration and efficiencies.

Corona Extra lager, 4.6%

There's something about drinking a

Its warm and intense flavor is finely balanced. Malty sweet, slightly burnt, and pleasantly bitter with a sweet aftertaste. Quadrupel continues to ferment after bottling and offers aromas of banana, almond, and vanilla.



Koningshoeven Brewery

Tilburg, Netherlands

A little tricky to get to, we stayed in Eindhoven. We arrived late, but met the brewer and he invited us back the next day for a private tour. We took advantage of that invite, including Nina pouring her own beer.



The pub had a wide spectrum of beers on tap.

Westmalle Dubbel

Trappist Dubbel, 7%

The brown-amber color illuminates this Trappist, and the subtle dark-malt aroma is balanced by Belgian yeast character. It is deeply malty, with a subtle and dry finish that hints of tropical fruit.

Westmalle, Belgium

There is a farm, cheese dairy and a brewery inside the walls of the Trappist Abbey. These three things are deliberately kept to a small scale, and particular care is taken of the people and the environment.



Rodenbach Grand Cru Flanders Red ale, 6%

A blend of “young” beer (33%) & an older beer (67%) that has matured in oak vats. This is a complex beer with lots of wood and fruity esters, wine-like and with a balsamic vinegar aroma. Sharp taste, fruity, refreshing and a balanced Madeira sweetness.



Brouwerij Rodenbach Roeselare, Belgium

Famous for brewing their Flanders style red ales, the original brewhouse dates to 872. We went on a tour with Bon



Beer Voyage, and had a great tasting event at the end.

Ayinger Weizenbock Wheat Bock, 8.7%



Classic Bavarian weisse beer spice and cloves aroma; smooth body from wheat and from decoction mashing; extravagant, pinpoint conditioning. The flavor offers the essence of the wheat harvest, fresh-baked bread. The finish is tropical fruit, cloves and banana.

Brauerei Aying Aying, Germany

Within walking distance to the brewery is a highly rated hotel and restaurant. Across the street from the



Gasthof is Liebhard's Braustüberl. Named after the founder and brewer in 1876.
